What Happens When You Call?

A master's level clinician will listen, assess the situation, and help determine the best next step.

Our team can:

- Meet you at home, school, or another safe community location
- Connect by telehealth when appropriate
- Provide rapid crisis intervention
- Help connect you with ongoing care and support

Our goal is to help people stay safe and receive the right care in the least restrictive setting whenever possible.

Anyone Can Call

You don't have to be the person in crisis.

Parents, family members, friends, teachers, healthcare providers, first responders, or anyone concerned about someone's safety can call for help.
